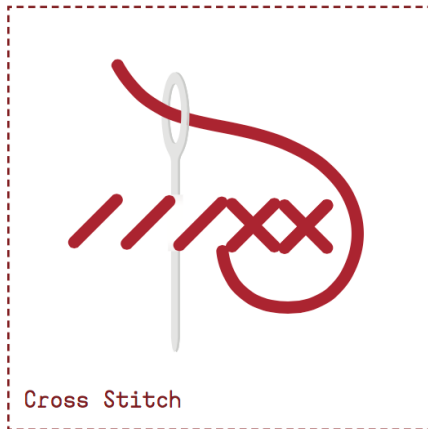

Tips for perfect Embroidery

- Use spray starch to give some body to your fabrics before embroidering.
- Use a hoop to hold your fabric taught and help keep your thread tension.
- Use a lightweight iron-on interfacing on the underside of your fabric, if it is very lightweight. You can also use 'Stitch and Tear' backing paper and then simply pull away the excess afterwards.
- Avoid bulky knots on the underside of your work.
- Use the slimmest needle that you are comfortable with. I like Milliners needles as they are long and slim and make minimum impact on your fabric.
- Use erasable marking tools to put the outline of your embroidery on to the fabric.
